FINAL ORDER GRANTING A CHANGE OF NAME OFADULT WITH GENDER MARKER CORRECTION/SEX ON BIRTH CERTIFICATE

On the _____ day of _____, 2017, this Court heard the Petition for Change of Name With Gender Marker Correction of the Petitioner, [Full Current Name], in accordance with Section 45.102 of the Texas Family Code authorizing a name change and Section 192.028 of the Texas Health and Safety Code to correct a birth certificate.

Petitioner appeared in person and announced ready.

The Court finds that it has jurisdiction of the case and of [Full Current Name], Petitioner.

The testimony heard by the Court was recorded by the court reporter assigned by the Court.

The Court makes the following findings about the Petitioner:

- 1. No discovery is intended.
- 2. Petitioner's current full name is [Full Current Name].
- 3. Petitioner's date of birth is [Full Month day, year].
- 4. Petitioner's city and state of birth are [City, State].
- 5. Petitioner's home address is [Street, City, County, State Zip].
- 6. The last four digits of the Petitioner's Security Number are [last four digits of Social Security Number]. The Court finds that listing the last four digits of the Petitioner's Social Security Number on the

Petition and Order in this Cause is necessary to protect the security of the Petitioner's Social Security Number.

7. Driver's License Number and issuing state for any license issued in the past ten (10) years:

No. [Driver's License Number] issued in the State of Texas. The Court finds that listing the last four digits of the Petitioner's Driver's License Number on the Petition and Order in this Cause is necessary to protect the security of the Petitioner's Driver's License Number.

- 8. Petitioner's original gender designation at birth was [enter gender assigned at birth].
- 9. Petitioner's race is [race].
- 10. Petitioner [does / does not] have a SID (State Identification) or FBI (Federal Bureau of Investigation) number.
- 11. Petitioner [has / has not] been charged with a crime above the grade of Class C misdemeanor.
- 12. Petitioner [has / has not] had a final conviction of a felony in this State or any other State or Federal jurisdiction.
- 13. Petitioner is not required to register as a sex offender under Chapter 62 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 14. Petitioner submitted a legible and complete set of fingerprints to the Texas Department of Public Safety with instructions to return a criminal history to the Court. The Court has received the results of that fingerprint analysis and finds the requirement of submission of a complete set of legible fingerprints as required by Texas Family Code Section 45.1002 has been satisfied.
- 15. The Petitioner has requested a name change from [current legal name] to [new name] along with a gender marker correction to [affirmed gender] because the Petitioner has undertaken the necessary treatment for gender transition. The Court has reviewed the documentation provided by the Petitioner and finds the Petitioner has completed all necessary treatment required by the World Professional Association for Transgender Health for gender transition.
- 16. The Court finds that it is in the best interest of the Petitioner and the best interest of society that the above petition be granted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Petitioner's name is changed from [Full Current Name] to [Full New Name] and the corresponding gender marker be corrected from [birth gender] to [affirmed gender].

IT IS ORDERED that the Texas Department of Public Safety issue upon application a driver's license, identification card, or other identification issued by the department with a corrected gender or sex marker changed from [male / female] to [female / male].

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any and all public and private agencies within the jurisdiction of this Court, upon request from the Petitioner, correct their records reflecting the Petitioner's name to [new name] and that the gender or sex marker be corrected to [male / female].

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any governmental department or agency or private company that requires a Court Order from a Court with jurisdiction over the Petitioner as part of their policies or procedures to correct and change the Petitioner's name and gender or sex marker use this order to fulfill the requirement of a court order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Texas Department of State Health Services, Vital Statistics Unit, upon application, issue to the Petitioner an amended Birth Certificate or a corrected replacement Birth Certificate correcting the sex of the Petitioner to [male / female].

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petitioner not use the change of name and not use the change of gender identification for purposes of avoiding any and all post or future financial or credit obligations or liabilities, or for purposes of fraud, or for circumventing any laws or ordinances of any jurisdiction.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all relief requested in this case not expressly granted is denied.
